		Work that celebrates cultural heritage of a specific community (e.g. Westwood, Montbello)
		Work in locations that are neighborhood relevant (e.g. libraries, parks, community gardens)

		Activities that support local artists in national / broader context and or endeavors

		Environmental organizations commissioning artists to interpret climate resilience
		Creative collaborations with transportation, housing, or youth development partners
